SEVENTH ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL ASBESTOS AWARENESS CONFERENCE APRIL 1 – 3, 2011, ATLANTA, GA

RENOWNED RESEARCHERS, SCIENTISTS, DOCTORS AND EDUCATORS WILL DISCUSS ASBESTOS: IMPACT ON PUBLIC HEALTH, ENVIRONMENT AND THE ECONOMY

REDONDO BEACH, CA – The Asbestos Disease Awareness Organization (ADAO), the largest U.S. organization serving as the voice of asbestos victims, presents its 7th Annual Asbestos Awareness Conference, *Asbestos: Impact on Public Health, Environment, and the Economy*. The event will be held April 1 - 3, 2011, at the Atlanta Marriott Buckhead Hotel & Conference Center. This conference is made possible with the support of the Barbara Ann Karmanos Cancer Institute.
